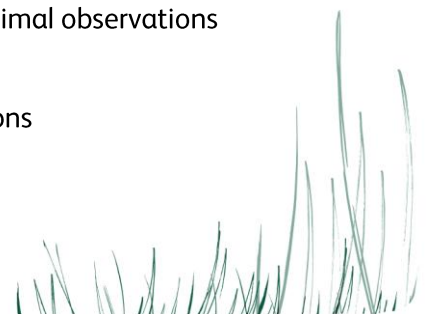

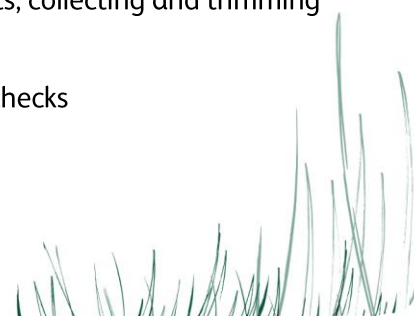

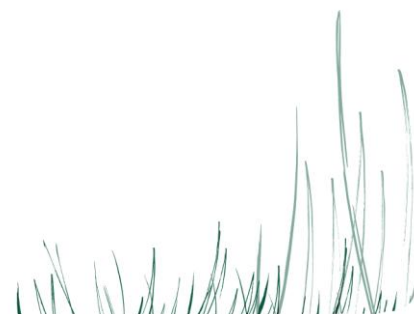

11:15-12:00	- Prepare for Free Flight Birds. Set up parrot stations with rewards, arrange crates & place props
12:00-12:45	- Assist in delivering Free Flight Birds; cameras & audio, bird release & pack up/clean up
12:45-13:30	- Lunch
13:30-14:15	- Prepare enrichment, clean aviaries, observe or assist in animal training sessions
14:15-15:00	- Prepare for Free Flight Birds. Set up parrot stations with rewards, arrange crates and place props
15:00-15:15	- Assist in delivering Free Flight Birds; cameras & audio, bird release & pack up/clean up
15:15-16:00	- Pack up post show, clean enclosures/crates and wash up equipment and food bowls

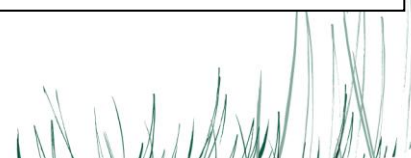

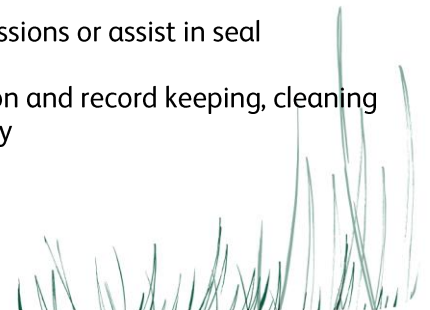
