Equipment

1 white or light coloured sheet

- 1 magnifying or regular jar
- 1 small soft brush
- 1 magnifying glass (if you
- have one!)

Instructions

- 1. Find a tree with a low lying branch.
- 2. Place the sheet underneath.
- 3. Gently shake the branch until you start to see a few things fall out.
- 4. When you spot a creature, gently place it into your jar. You may need to use your soft brush to guide it in.
- 5. Use the chart above to identify!
